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Notice Regarding Revision of Year-end Dividend Forecast (Dividend Increase)

At the meeting of the Board of Directors held today, ID Holdings Corporation resolved to revise its forecast of the year-end dividend per share as follows.

1. Revision of dividend forecast per share

2. Reason for revision of dividend forecast

The Group recognizes the return of earnings to shareholders as a management issue of vital importance. As such, the Group strives to secure a robust management base, stable revenues and improved return on equity, supporting a basic policy of continuing appropriate distribution of earnings backed by solid business results. The Group also aims to achieve a total return ratio of 50–60%, combining dividends and acquisitions of treasury shares.

In view of the current favorable trend in business results, the Group has decided to revise the year-end dividend forecast for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026. This revision aims to enhance returns to the employees while also providing greater returns to the shareholders. The dividend per share will be increased by ¥10 from the previous forecast of ¥35, resulting in a revised forecast of ¥45 per share. Consequently, the annual

dividend forecast for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026, including the interim dividend of ¥35, will be ¥70 to ¥80. This represents an increase of ¥10 from the actual dividend of ¥70 paid for the previous fiscal year (ending March 31, 2025). Furthermore, based on the net income forecast for the current fiscal year, the total return ratio is calculated to be 52.9%.

The Group will continue its efforts to strengthen measures to return earnings to shareholders in accordance with business growth.

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
