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1. Overview of Operating Results and Others

(1) Overview of operating results for the period

During the first six months of the fiscal year ending December 31, 2025, the global economy remained subject to future uncertainty amid factors that included the Russia-Ukraine war, situations in the Middle East, and other such geopolitical risks, a prolonged slump in China's real estate market, concerns of a worldwide economic downturn triggered by U.S. tariff measures, escalation of U.S.-China trade friction, and foreign exchange market volatility. The Japanese economy also remained susceptible to adverse conditions amid a persisting scenario of rising prices driven by surging energy resource and raw material prices as well as exchange rate fluctuations, despite continuance of robust inbound demand and other such factors.

Under these circumstances, total net sales increased 3.1% year on year to \(\frac{\text{\$\text{\$\gentif{\generation}}}{80}\) million in the period under review. The increase was a result of higher revenue in the Valve Manufacturing Business reflecting higher sales volumes in both domestic and overseas markets along with effects of price revisions implemented during the third quarter of the previous fiscal year, more than offsetting a decline in sales for semiconductor manufacturing equipment. The increase is also attributable to higher revenue in the Brass Bar Manufacturing Business mainly due to higher sales volume.

In terms of profit and loss, operating profit increased 21.9% year on year to \$7,933 million, mainly due to the increased revenue from higher sales volume in the Valve Manufacturing Business, despite factors such as the higher repair expenses in the Brass Bar Manufacturing Business. Ordinary profit increased 14.0% year on year to \$8,373 million, and profit attributable to owners of parent was up 10.1% year on year to \$5,968 million.

The operating results by segment are as follows:

(i) Valve Manufacturing Business

In the Valve Manufacturing Business, net sales to external customers increased 0.8% year on year to \$69,093 million, mainly due to higher sales volumes in both the domestic and overseas markets as well as effects of price revisions implemented during the third quarter of the previous fiscal year, more than offsetting a decline in sales for semiconductor manufacturing equipment. Operating profit increased 22.8% year on year to \$9,815 million, mainly due to the increased revenue from higher sales volume.

(ii) Brass Bar Manufacturing Business

In the Brass Bar Manufacturing Business, net sales to external customers increased 13.9% year on year to \(\xi\)16,140 million, mainly due to higher sales volume. Operating profit decreased 49.9% year on year to \(\xi\)308 million, mainly due to higher repair expenses despite higher sales volume.

(iii) Other

In Other Businesses, net sales to external customers increased by 3.7% year on year to \(\frac{1}{47}\) million, and operating profit decreased by 75.1% year on year to \(\frac{1}{48}\) million.

(2) Overview of financial position for the period under review

Assets at the end of the period under review increased by ¥30 million from the end of the previous fiscal year to ¥172,436 million. This increase was mainly due to increases in property, plant and equipment and inventories, despite a decrease in cash and deposits.

Liabilities decreased by ¥1,059 million from the end of the previous fiscal year to ¥61,536 million, primarily due to a reduction in bonds payable, despite an increase in long-term borrowings.

Net assets increased by \$1,090 million from the end of the previous fiscal year to \$110,900 million. This increase was mainly due to the recording of \$5,968 million in profit attributable to owners of parent, despite the payment of dividends and a decrease in foreign currency translation adjustment.

(Cash flows)

Cash and cash equivalents ("cash") at the end of the period under review decreased by \(\xi_3,957\) million from the end of the previous fiscal year to \(\xi_26,482\) million.

The status of the respective cash flows and their relevant factors during the period under review are as follows.

(i) Cash flows from operating activities

Net cash provided by operating activities amounted to \$5,334 million (compared to \$8,613 million provided in the same period of the previous fiscal year). This was mainly due to inflows including profit before income taxes of \$8,620 million and depreciation of \$3,299 million, despite outflows including an increase in inventories of \$2,729 million and income taxes paid of \$2,473 million.

(ii) Cash flows from investing activities

Net cash used in investing activities amounted to \(\frac{\pm44,734}{4,734}\) million (compared to \(\frac{\pm44,123}{4,123}\) million used in the same period of the previous fiscal year). This was mainly due to outflows including purchase of property, plant and equipment of \(\frac{\pm44,699}{4,699}\) million primarily in the Valve Manufacturing Business.

(iii) Cash flows from financing activities

Net cash used in financing activities was \$3,566 million (compared to \$4,081 million used in the same period of the previous fiscal year). This was mainly due to outflows including redemption of bonds of \$10,067 million, dividends paid of \$2,356 million and repayments of long-term borrowings of \$906 million, despite inflows including proceeds from long-term borrowings of \$10,000 million.

(3) Explanation of consolidated earnings forecasts and other forward-looking statements

There are no changes in consolidated earnings forecasts for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2025, released on February 13, 2025.

Potential effects of U.S. tariff measures on the Group's financial results are currently under review. If it becomes necessary to revise the earnings forecasts, we will disclose the revised forecasts promptly.

Notes on changes in accounting policies

Application of the "Accounting Standard for Current Income Taxes," Etc.

The Company has applied the "Accounting Standard for Current Income Taxes" (Accounting Standards Board of Japan (ASBJ) Statement No. 27, October 28, 2022; the "Revised Accounting Standard of 2022"), etc. from the beginning of the period under review.

Revisions to categories for recording current income taxes (taxation on other comprehensive income) conform to the transitional treatment in the proviso of paragraph 20-3 of the Revised Accounting Standard of 2022 and to the transitional treatment in the proviso of paragraph 65-2(2) of the "Guidance on Accounting Standard for Tax Effect Accounting" (ASBJ Guidance No. 28, October 28, 2022; the "Revised Guidance of 2022"). This change in accounting policies has no impact on the semi-annual consolidated financial statements.

In addition, for changes related to the revised treatment in consolidated financial statements when a gain or loss on sale arising from the sale of shares of subsidiaries, etc. among consolidated companies is deferred for tax purposes, the Revised Guidance of 2022 has been applied from the beginning of the period under review. This change in accounting policies has been applied retrospectively, and is reflected in the semi-annual consolidated financial statements for the same period of the previous fiscal year and the consolidated financial statements for the previous fiscal year. This change in accounting policies has no impact on the semi-annual consolidated financial statements for the same period of the previous fiscal year and the consolidated financial statements for the previous fiscal year.

Notes on accounting treatment specific to the preparation of semi-annual consolidated financial statements

Tax expense is calculated by reasonably estimating the effective tax rate after applying tax effect accounting to profit before income taxes for the fiscal year including the period under review, and multiplying profit before income taxes by this estimated effective tax rate.

However, in cases where the calculation of tax expenses using the estimated effective tax rate yields a result that is considered not to be reasonable to a significant extent, the statutory effective tax rate is used.
